The purpose of the BULLETIN is to serve WDA members in the exchange of scientific data relating to diseases of wildlife and in the distribution of information concerning the policies and activities of the Association and its members.

SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION intended for publication in the BULLETIN may be submitted to the Editor at any time. Manuscripts submitted in duplicate will be given prompt review and consideration for publication. Articles considered appropriate for the BULLETIN are (1) original research reports with illustrations, (2) research notes, (3) case histories, serologic surveys, or reports of epizootics. Manuscripts reporting original research should be written in a form similar to that used by the Journal of Bacteriology. Style should follow that suggested by the AIBS Style Manual for Biological Journals. Case histories, serologic surveys and epizootic reports should follow the Style Manual in language usage, but, with minor limitations, their form may reflect the author's choice. Reprints may be ordered at the time notice is given of manuscript acceptance. Authors of original research papers will be given 100 reprints free of charge, but the basic rate per hundred will be charged for desired reprints in excess of 100. Authors of notes, case reports, etc., desiring reprints will be charged the basic per hundred rate, \$8.00. NON-SCIENTIFIC INFORMATION such as official announcements, news of activities of the WDA or its members, future meetings, new wildlife disease research projects, etc., intended for publication in any issue must reach the editor's desk by the 15th of the second month preceding the month of issue, i.e., November 15th for the January issue, etc.
