INSTRUCTIONS TO AUTHORS: Manuscripts appropriate for the Journal of Wildlife Diseases are research papers and brief research notes on diseases of wildlife. **Submit to the editor double-spaced typed manuscripts in triplicate including three copies of all illustrations.** Follow recommendations of the CBE Style Manual for Biological Journals. Publication charges are made on articles which are longer than four pages, or contain more than one illustration or one page of tabulated material. These charges are \$15.00 for each extra page, \$20.00 for each extra page of tabulated material and \$5.00 for each extra illustration up to one-half page in size. The charge for each extra full-page illustration is \$10.00. Charges for reprints depend upon the number of pages the article contains and the number of copies ordered. A reprint charge schedule and order form is mailed to authors at or about the time they receive the page proofs.
